Later when Din meets Bo-Katan for the first time he is told he is a "Child of the Watch". Later in season 3 of the Mandalorian it is explained by the Armorer that "Death Watch is no more" and that "it splintered into many warring factions". So just who are these saviors that came to the rescue of the young Din Djarin? Many people hypothesize that the Live Action Death Watch warriors we see on screen in season one of The Mandalorian are one of those first factions, still carrying the name. Others wonder if the these saviors merely rescued Din and then left him in the care of the fighting core. In any case one thing we can be certain of; these are different Death Watch from the ones we have seen in comic and cartoons.

UNDER THE BUCKET MEET NIK & NINA

You know, every so often you get to meet a couple of people in the MMCC who are entirely delightful. Nik & Nina of Shonare Vhekadla Clan, are just those kinds folks.

BATTLECRY: How did you discover the MMCC?

NIK: In my mind, that goes back to coming up with couples Halloween costumes, and at one point Nina said we should try our hand at cosplay. That just set my mind. Immediately I knew I wanted to build a Mandalorian. In the process of trying to look up how to do that, I discovered the MMCC is a thing, and then

NINA: Oh yeah,

I remember that. It was at the last Nightmare Before Christmas party our friend hosted between Halloween and Christmas. We always came up with some great couple costumes and we really thought we nailed it that year, but nobody knew who we were supposed to be. That was when I said we clearly we need to look into cosplay with likeminded people. Nik quickly said, "so that's permission?"

NJK: That's when we dressed up as Guy and Molotov Girl from Free Guy; right?

NINA: Yeah, that's the one. I actually forgot that's how it started. I just figured Nik was a Star Wars super nerd and knew the MMCC existed.

NIK: I knew there are a lot of Mandos out there, but I just thought they were part of the 501st. In researching how to build a Mando, I realized the Mercs were their own thing and you get the chance to express yourself as a Mando."

BATTLECRY: What about the MMCC inspired you to

want to join and to build your armor as a couple?

NINF: This is just something Nik has wanted to do since he was an itty bitty little boy and thought that seven minutes of Boba Fett was the most amazing thing in the world.

NIK: I mean, he definitely looked the coolest.

NINF: For me, I think there's definitely a huge nod to Trent, Ruus'alor Sol'yc supreme of SVC because I went with Nik to Trent's house one day and he asked me when I was going to start building a kit. I told him I don't know Star Wars near as well and wanted Nik to be able to enjoy this for himself. But Trent had planted

enough of a seed that I started looking into what the Mercs do. And that was when I was like, okay, I'm digging the charity events and things like that

for the kids.

NJK: As for building our armor together, it just seemed like fun and Nina was down to do it.

BATTLECRY: What were the challenges of building together, and how were they overcome?

NJK: We found out each other had strengths and weaknesses. Like, Nina can't spray gloss black without a drip.

NINA: Don't forget primer.

NJK: Yes, dripping primer too, which is somehow amazing. We've known how to work together for going on 15 years now. Just about everything we do we work together. But as far as the actual creation of something, just getting into it and seeing where each other's strong points were and maybe some weak points and just complementing each other as best we could. You know, if somebody was a little bit weak on something, how the other person kind of jump in and



help and vice versa.

NINF: Yeah, and to that point, when one of us would get frustrated with something, it was kind of on the other one of us to balance it and encourage, give each other a motivational boost. Definitely one of the things that was challenging was when our paces would shift. For example, initially I was frustrated because it seemed like Nik was suddenly just sprinting past me and then he slowed down and I sped up and then I slowed down again. Staying at that even pace in the motivation was greatest when we were right about head to head.

NJK: Yeah, we're not competitive at all.

Nina: Ha! Right? But the really big challenge for me was when it came to the application process because we learned that I operate on Manriquez time even for this. Nik's application process was substantially quicker than mine, but we wanted to get approved together,

which we ultimately didn't. Still we were approved within a month of each other. So that final leg of it was probably the biggest challenge for me.

NIK: Yeah, I suppose if Nina is going to mention it we should explain that all the women in my family run 15 minutes late, what we affectionately refer to as Manriquez time, and which Nina instantly fit in with.

NINA: Yes, and the fun part of that 15 minutes is that my catalog number is exactly 15 after Nik's.

BATTLECRY: (I haven't seen your armor, so I'm going off the cuff) Did you build/paint with a "family theme" in mind or did you each do your own thing?

NIK: We very much did our own thing.

NINF: Yes, we did. What was your inspiration for doing a more beat up Survivor desert kit?

Nik: Growing up in southern Arizona, you go shoot out in the desert a lot. And invariably, there's a rusted beat up old car that's just out in the middle of nowhere. I like to use the phrase forgotten by time. It's just been sitting there existing for however many years, full of bullet holes, just trash. I've always

thought there's a little kind of unique beauty to that. And when I think of the desert, that's just what I think of is old rusted out, beat up cars out in the middle of nowhere.

NINA: So you wanted to look like one?

NJK: I feel like one.

they? I know my motivation with my color scheme is basically the reward that just keeps on coming because I wanted to come up with something that was going to be a little more fun, bright and kind of light that any little boys and girls that saw it would be like, ooh, that's pretty. I have received that very reaction constantly already. I'm also six feet tall and a very large female, so being able to feminize my armor to a degree was kind of a bonus for me.



BATTLECRY: Working together toward your mutual goal of membership, what did you learn about each other?

NJK: I learned that Nina can't spray black spray paint or gloss black without having puddles. We both operate in extremely different ways, you know, we would sit on opposite sides of one table and it was pretty obvious who was working on each side.

NINA: Oh, you're messy. You're messy.

NJK: Mm hmm.

NINA: As we got more involved in the process, it wasn't just building our kits. I would say we learned during the pandemic that we work really well together, this just gave us something new to do together. But in the process of working with Ruus'alor's and other officers of the clan, we jumped right into developing events and seeing what capabilities and opportunities we had just from the early standpoint as UM's. We were able to be a part of creating and hosting successful events that people enjoy, such as the semi-annual Forge & Feast weekend long BBQ/armor party and the Mardji Bantha Christmas gift exchange armor party. This is all about each of us taking on our own part. I'm good at organizing and keeping everything together as the hostess for the event and Nik oversees food and a little bit more of the direct interaction with everyone as far as what they're building, ideas and that kind of stuff.

BRTTLECRY: You say that you haven't been OM's for very long, (only a couple of months) but in that time, have you been able to troop? If so, what is your favorite event? What makes it special to you?

NJK: Anything where I can really see kids get excited. For me, it would be a toss up between the first troop that we did together as handlers for the 4th of July parade in Flagstaff last year, which we just got to troop as OM's this year. The kids just go crazy for the Star Wars clubs in the parade, and I love it.

NJNA: Yes! So many sticky fingered high fives from excited kids.

NIK: Oh yeah! And then the other one I did was for pediatric oncology Survivors's Day, there was an event that I was able to attend that Nina unfortunately wasn't able to. There was a little girl there that I later found out about because she was on the news. She was three years old and had survived leukemia and she was the most excited person I've ever seen in my life. It just put a grin on my face from ear to ear. So it's a toss up between those two. I'll just say anything where kids are super

stoked.

NINF: I agree. So really it's almost like all of the events because the kids are always stoked. The 4th of July parade was amazing, and it was exhausting, in a great way. Definitely some wonderful reactions from kids, but I would have to say for me, it was actually the very first troop I got to do. I was still a UM, but it was my test run for my kit while my application was in. My biggest memory from that day was this little girl that ran outside after me, she wanted to know my name and asked for a picture with me. She only went up to my knees, she was so small, but her excitement was enormous. It was adorable! It probably also has to do with the fact that this first troop was on May 4th, so we'll never forget it.

BRTTLECRY: Being a family, yourselves, and now being a part of a larger family of Mandos, what does "Family is More than Blood" mean to you?

NJK: To me, that's kind of just the way I grew up. My family was constantly adopting my friends. Everybody called my parents mom and dad, and you develop those tight friendships where they do just become family. Now on a personal note, I lost my mom three years ago and things haven't exactly been the same with my family since. The club has really filled the void in a way. I'm Hispanic and I come from a gigantic family anyway, so having a new 3,000 plus member family is par.

NINA: I come from a much more broken, very, very small family. I've always been more of a loner, a bit of an introvert as a result. But when I really think about this question, it makes me think of my husband, he's the person I chose. I didn't have to. I didn't have to love him. I didn't have to anything, but I chose him. And he is the most important person in my life now. So when it comes down to aliit ori'shya tal'din, my husband is my first proof that family is more than blood. The Shonare Vhekadla Clan and the MMCC have embraced us completely, taken us in as foundlings, developed us into the new OM's we are today, and the future OM's we plan to be with a greater level of involvement. So it really is all about the family that we choose and we've all chosen each other. I don't doubt for a second that every single one of them would have our back if we needed it. That's what I think family's more than blood is, is that choice that we've made to be each other's family and be there for each other no matter what.

NIK: Exactly!

BATTLECRY: What is Ori'Ramikad?

ERUN: The Order of Ori'Ramikad (OR) is the most prestigious honor bestowed by the MMCC upon members who exemplify the highest ideals and consistently go above and beyond for the overall benefit of the club.

ERUN: While I am not sure of the total number, the MMCC inducts 4-6 members into the OR each year. Currently, there are approximately 20-30 active members of the Order.

We reached out to Kal Vizsla, Alor'ad of Mexico's BigFang clan, who was gracious enough to answer our questions! We're also trying something new, in presenting the interview in both Spanish and English we hope to honor the native language of the clan.

SPANISH:

BATTLECRY: ¿Cuándo se creó el clan?

KFL: Formo parte de manera oficial a finales de 2007, y el clan fue fundado en 2008 con solo 3 miembros. El nombre "BigFang" esta inspirado en que por nuestra zona del país, los restos paleontológicos más comunes son de mamuts y en los museos siempre se pueden ver los cráneos y sus grandes colmillos. Unir ese concepto con la leyenda de los mythosaurios fluye en forma inmediata.

ENGLISH: BATTLECRY: When was the clan created?

KRL: It was formed unofficially near the end of 2007, and the clan was founded in 2008 with only

three members. The name "BigFang" is inspired by the fact that in our region of the country, the most common paleontological remains are those of mammoths, and in museums you can always see their skulls and huge tusks. Combining that idea with the legend of mythosaurs was very straightforward.

SPANISH:

BRTTLECRY: ¿Cuántos miembros oficiales tienen ustedes?

KRL: Actualmente con 17 activos.

BATTLECRY: How many official members do you have?

KAL: Currently we have 17 active.

KRL: We don't actually do that much for charity, but when the opportunity arises, we like to support external projects where we're invited, such as fundraisers for low-income students, cultural and artistic development for kids, where art exhibits are exhibited, and parades where the beneficiaries are charity organizations for children. Although most of the donations are monetary, we as a clan never directly accept or take part in them - on the contrary, we support those who receive these donations so they receive them directly at the time. Our support consists of promoting the event on our social media, assisting with the organization, and even arranging chairs if necessary. Our support is on all levels.

NERF & MUSHROOM MINI-QUICHE

Ingredients:

1 package of frozen Puff Pastry or Phyllo Dough

8 slices bacon

1/4 pound fresh mushrooms, chopped

1 tablespoon butter

1/3 cup green onion, chopped

1 2/3 cup swiss cheese, shredded

5 eggs

1 2/3 cups sour cream

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- 2. On a lightly floured board, roll out pastry dough. Using a 3" cutter, cut out 42 circles; reroll scraps as needed.
- 3. Fit circles into bottoms and slightly up sides of lightly greased 2 1/2" muffin pan. Meanwhile fry bacon until crisp; drain; crumble or chop.
- 4. Chop mushrooms, sauté in butter until limp and liquid evaporates. Combine bacon, mushrooms, green onion and cheese. Divide filling equally among the muffin cups.
- 5. In large bowl, beat together eggs, add sour cream and stir until smooth. Spoon about 1 tablespoon into each muffin cup. Bake until puffed and light brown, 20 to 25 minutes. Cool in pan 5 minutes; lift out.
- 6. Serve warm or let cool on wire racks. If made ahead, wrap cooled quiches airtight overnight. Reheat, uncovered, in 350-degree oven for about 10 minutes.
