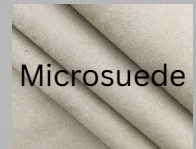

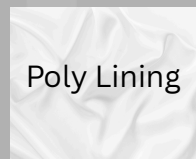
FANCY FABRICS

These fabrics are usable as accent pieces like capes, sashes and linings of garments



LINING FABRICS

Lightweight fabrics that can be used as an interior layer for all soft parts. These fabrics are too light weight to meet the sturdy fabric requirement.



COMMONLY APPROVED FABRICS

These fabrics are sturdy enough to be used for flightsuits, vests, and all other accent pieces.

- There are various weights to these* fabrics. The heavyweight versions are approvable for flightsuits, vests and all other softs parts. The lightweight variants must be doubled, reinforced or used a linings.
